- due to copyright and privacy reasons, the recordings will not be available after Dec. 17th.




Indigenous Education Newsletter

Winter Solstice

The winter solstice, Dec 21st, is when we have the fewest hours of sun and the most hours of darkness. For many Indigenous communities, this time is a time for ceremony, drumming, dancing, and storytelling. It is a time of renewal. Winter presents an excellent opportunity for storytelling as the colder weather prevents people from growing, hunting, and gathering. "It was in the winter, with the long dark evenings, the snow and wind blowing outside, that telling stories was a way to entertain and teach the children. To have a storyteller tell you a story is like receiving agift. To be respectful, a gift of tobacco is offered to the storyteller before the story begins. The storyteller will often take the tobacco outside and place it on the earth as an offering" (Zotigh, 2017) to the land.



Snow Snake! The object of the game is to throw the snow snake (stick) the farthest distance along a smooth trough made in the snow. Teams alternate tosses. Use distance markers to keep track or make score markers!
