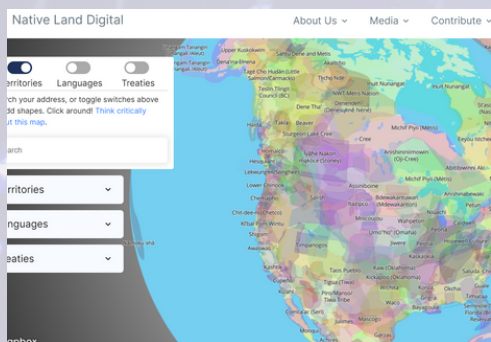

Interactive Land Map



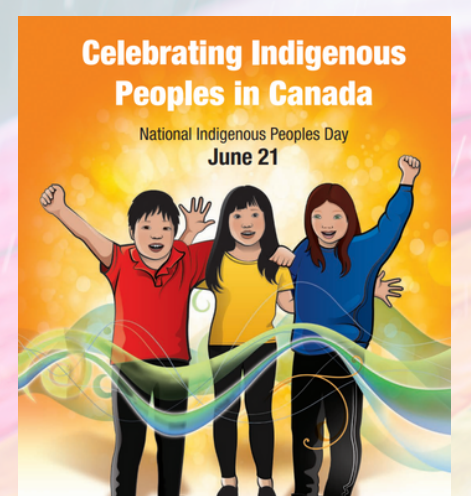

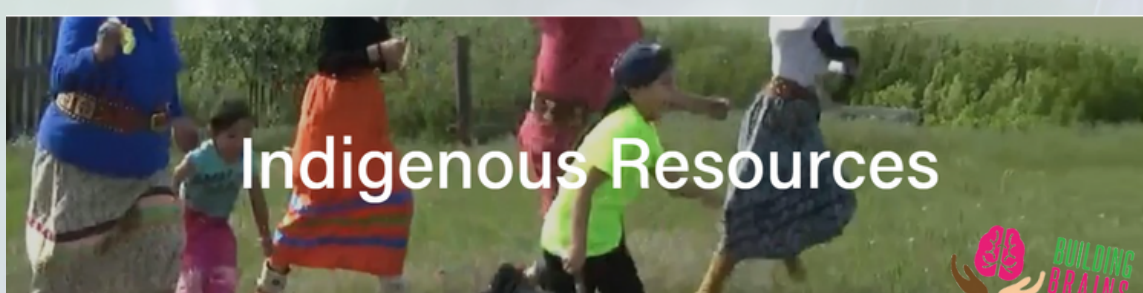
