Leadership Roles: Offering students opportunities to lead, including grade 5 nutrition leaders and assembly organizers.

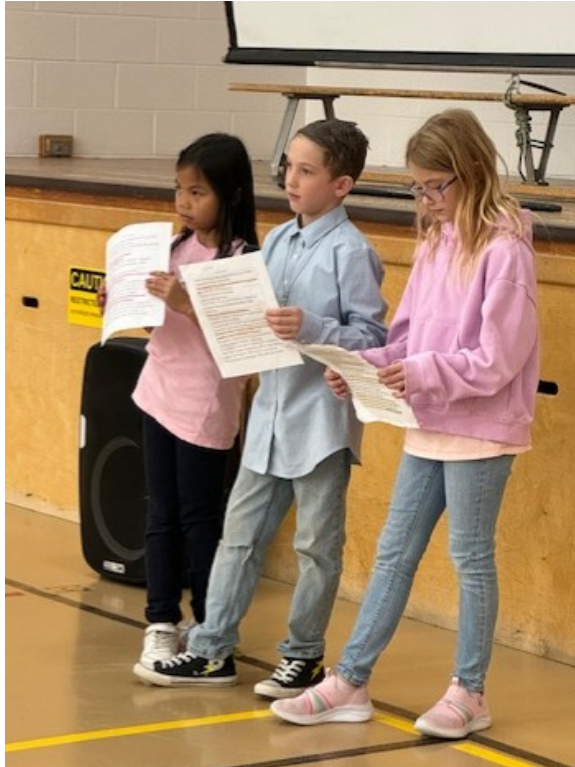
Restorative Practices: Supporting students through relationship-building and proactive classroom engagement.
